Performance Series—Winter Results

Next week a communication will be sent to all 3rd-5th grade families with information on how to access winter Performance Series results. Performance Series tests are computer-based assessments that adjust to each child's mathematics and reading ability levels and are administered to students in grades 3-7 in District 303. All tests begin in relation to your child's current grade level; however, as your child answers each question, the test adapts according to his or her response. The questions become easier when answers are incorrectly provided and get more challenging as correct answers are given. This type of assessment individualizes every testing experience so that it more accurately measures your child's ability. The results provide parents with accurate information regarding your child's growth academically, and also give immediate results to teachers that allow them to adjust instruction in order to better meet the needs of individual students.

PARCC Testing

Our annual PARCC testing window will begin after Spring Break and will continue through April 20th. During the testing window, all 3rd-5th grade students will participate in three English/Language Arts assessments and four Mathematics assessments. A more detailed schedule will be provided to all parents by the end of next week. To minimize the amount of make-up testing, student attendance is important. Once the PARCC testing schedule is shared, please do your best to schedule appointments, etc. around the provided times.

2018-2019 CUSD 303 Community Preschool Program Lottery

For the 2018-2019 school year, District 303 will offer a five-day-a-week, half-day, morning or afternoon preschool program.

The program will be open to 3-5 year old children who reside within the D303 school boundaries and who are 3 years old by September 1, 2018. Children who are 5 years old by September 1, 2018 will not be eligible for enrollment.

The tuition cost for the program is \$285 per month. A \$100 annual non-refundable registration and materials fee will also be required.*Tuition and registration and materials fee pending board approval.

The school board is currently reviewing a proposal from District Administration to close and repurpose an elementary school to an Early Childhood Center. A decision from the School Board to move forward will impact elementary school attendance boundaries and the locations for D303 Community Preschool. With a yes vote for an EC Center, Norton Creek preschool students would attend preschool at the Fox Ridge/EC Center location.

We anticipate the Board will be voting on the proposal at their March 12, 2018 regular meeting. For detailed information regarding the proposal and School Board discussion, please visit the District 303 website at www.d303.org

Little Caesars Pizza Fundraiser



Students in grades 3 through 8 will be taking state tests in English/Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics sometime between April 2 and April 20. Additionally, students in grades 5, 8, and in their first high school biology course will be taking the Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) for one day within the month of April. Please consult with your school for a more specific test schedule. These assessments are designed to evaluate students' progress toward the more rigorous state standards.

Please encourage your child to give his or her best effort and, as always, preparing your child for a good day at school begins with a good night of sleep and a nutritional breakfast.

These state tests are one of several ways student achievement is measured in CUSD 303. Your child's daily school work, teacher comments, and report cards are also important when determining overall school achievement. If you have any questions regarding your child's performance, be sure to talk with your child's teacher or principal.

PARCC results will be reported in the fall on the State School Report Cards. You will also receive information about your child's individual performance.
